## 21ST CENTURY BOARDING AT KNOX

Knox is one of Australia's leading Boarding Schools specialising in boys' education; Knox prepares boys for university and the world beyond.

The background of our boarding community is genuinely mixed – boys come from country properties and towns, surrounding suburbs and overseas.

Outstanding performance over the last five years in HSC results validates the structured daily study program, which includes visiting tutors as well as break time, where the School's impressive facilities are available for the Boarding Community to use.

Knox recognises the diversity of modern family and work situations with a flexible approach to working with families regarding leave arrangements but still encouraging the student to make the most of Boarder weekend activities and programs.

Boarders have the benefit of first class facilities including the new Dining Room, already in operation.

We provide:

- secure, comfortable accommodation within a family community
- Year group housing making it easy to develop friendships
- 24-hour supervision and support by professional, friendly staff
- a quality, balanced diet provided by professional caterers
- structured and assisted evening study
- after-school sporting, outdoor education and cultural activities



- extended use of superb facilities
- scheduled weekend activities and outings
- on-site clinic

The new five-level Boarding House will be ready in 2010 and will feature the traditional Knox architectural elements – brickwork, gables, windows and corbels. Each will provide a consistent thread to blend with the Main Building and KG1. The design allows for much flexibility and provides the following state-of-the-art facilities:

- Single rooms for senior boarders (Y11-12) with ensuite
- Quad rooms for junior boarders (Y7-10) with two ensuites
- Recreation rooms, breakout spaces, kitchen facilities and reading and study areas
- Clinic, comprising an 8-bed ward, nurses' overnight accommodation unit and observation ward

Boarders at Knox continue to benefit enormously from the structured study environment and tutoring provided; their HSC results reveal a consistent pattern of superior academic achievement. Most boarders in 2008 exceeded their expectations and gained admittance to the universities of their choice to study Engineering, Arts and Economics among others; the 2008 top Knox boarder UAI was 97.50.

Some of our rural boarders are experiencing a change in environment by undertaking an overseas GAP year, before commencing their tertiary studies, working in English boarding schools.
