



ROLE DESCRIPTION

LEAD JUNIOR SWIM COACH

ROLE PURPOSE

The Lead Junior Swim Coach will professionally conduct swimming squad sessions and pool operational requirements at Knox Grammar School Aquatic Centre. They will ensure the provision of exceptionally high standard of programs for the benefit of all users of the Centre. The coach's role will be to improve the swimming standard and the competitive skills of each swimmer while promoting competitive swimming. The Lead Junior Swim Coach has a responsibility to ensure the swimmers have a fun and positive experience.

ROLE RESPONSIBILITY

The Lead Junior Swim Coach reports directly to the Director of Aquatic Sports and Head Coach. The coach is responsible to ensure that all staff involved in the coaching of swimming meet the standards and expectations of Knox Grammar School.

The coach will be required to work mornings, afternoons/evenings and weekends (in the Knox squad program). The Swimming Coach will be required to coach a range of stroke development squads, competitive squads as well as a growing Adult squad.

The Junior Squads train 2-4 times a week for 60-90 minutes. The coach role is to improve the swimmers technique and develop race skills. The coach will be required to support the swimmers at club competitions, school competitions and club race nights.

ROLE ACCOUNTABILITY

Knowledge

- Knowledge and ability to pre-plan and develop session structures.
- Conduct squad sessions to meet the defined needs of the students.
- Basic pool operations/safety guidelines

Responsibility/Experience

- To act as a member of the Knox Grammar School team and assist in advising matters to do with swimming instruction, coaching and other appropriate matters.
- As a swim coach, be responsible for the efficient and effective implementation of the programs and policies of the pool and to ensure the resources are most effectively deployed.
- Assist the Head Coach and Aquatic Centre Manager in ensuring awareness of all educational programs provided and to promote them in a positive manner.
- To be responsible for the maintenance of equipment, cleanliness of the storage area and setting up and putting away of all equipment required for lessons.
- To implement the pool's guidelines on safety procedures and operations to ensure a genuine concern for users safety.
- To keep accurate student history and attendance records for every class and advise swim school staff when students are to be upgraded and certificates to be issued.
- Be aware of the pool's record management policy, creating and filing records of business activity as required.
- To open and close pool when required.
- Conduct pool water tests and report anomalies.
- Attend Knox/Pymble Swimming Club's targeted carnivals as required.
- Take responsibility for the highest junior squad
- Act as a leader/mentor to the other squad coaches
- Develop swim programs that are engaging and oriented to a wide range of student motivations
- Be responsible for overseeing many aspects of junior swimming at Knox and work with parents/children in their swimming journey through Knox.

Performance/Skills Standards

- Exhibit the highest standards of swimming instruction and customer service.
- Punctuality and attendance will be expected.
- Adhering to all staff uniforms and personal presentation guidelines.
- Maintenance of qualifications and skills must be current.
- Continual application of enthusiasm and motivation will be expected.

General

- Attend all staff meetings and training sessions as required.
- Carry out all legitimate requests for assistance from the Head Coach and other delegated supervisors.
- All actions and conduct will be made in the best interest of the Knox Grammar School.

- Teacher of Competitive Strokes certification (Essential)
- Experience in coaching junior competitive swimmers (Essential)
- Senior First Aid Certificate, CPR/Resuscitation Certificate (Essential)
- Bronze Coaching license (Desirable)
- Pool Life Guard (Desirable)
- Relevant tertiary qualification (Desirable)

WORK HEALTH & SAFETY

The incumbent will actively support and contribute to the maintenance and development of a safe working environment by:

- Reporting incidents or accidents to the appropriate staff as soon as possible.
- Working within the WHS management systems that have been adopted by the School.

APPRAISAL AND REVIEW CONDITIONS

As with all members of staff, the Swim Coach will be expected to participate in a regular appraisal program as an integral part of their professional development. The appraisal program shall set strategic objectives and performance measures consistent with the responsibilities of the position.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT & REMUNERATION

This is permanent part-time position. Remuneration for the position will be commensurate with qualifications, skills and experience and in accordance with the terms and conditions of the *Educational Services (Schools) General Staff Award NSW 2010*.
