The Year 11 teachers are looking forward to the student led Parent/Teacher Conference on Monday.

With Year 11 being only a three term course we are nearing the mid-way point of the academic year. Despite being in Term 2, some subjects haven't yet done an assessment as a result of the new NESA mandate whereby only three assessments are permitted in each subject. Teachers will, however, have data and information on formative work that has been completed to date to assist in providing a guide as to current progress.

To help prepare for Monday evening, an Interim Report will be issued this afternoon at 3.30pm. The report will be available through Student Café and Parent Lounge. This report will only have an assessment mark and average where applicable. There will be no homework and class work commitment, APA or comments. For subjects that haven't had a formal assessment to date the subject will have no entries on the report.

An official Half Yearly Report will be issued at the end of this term and the Yearly Report will be available at the end of Term 3.

Our hope is that the boys will take the initiative in the interviews on Monday and be well prepared so they are leading the interview. We have encouraged the boys to think of Monday as not being a Parent/Teacher interview, instead it should be seen as a Student Led Conference. To assist in this preparation the boys have been asked to consider and articulate the following ***for each subject***

- What worked well and needs to be continued,
- Whether the Term 1 Study Break (holiday period) was utilised well,
- Assess the degree of completion of Term 1 work,
- Recalls the dates, requirements and expectations for each assessment this term,
- Outline a study plan including preparation for the assessment task this term,
- Summarise the priorities that need to be addressed.
