FROM THE TEAM LEADERS

It could be staying late at school to be seen doing homework, doing an extra-curricular commitment that is not enjoyed or attending a social event on the weekend when it be better to stay home and relax. This week it would be great for the boys to nicely say 'No' to one!

Some helpful hints; don't think of saying no as selfish, you need to look after number one. Secondly, don't say no without a reason, educate the requester why you cannot help out or attend.

In mentor, we have started using mindfulness and the smiling mind apps to help the boys get in touch with the present and to appreciate moments of calm and relaxation. The wellbeing team has also organised Monday and Thursday lunch time 'Study without Stress' sessions which we strongly encourage the boys to attend.


