FROM THE CAREERS ADVISOR

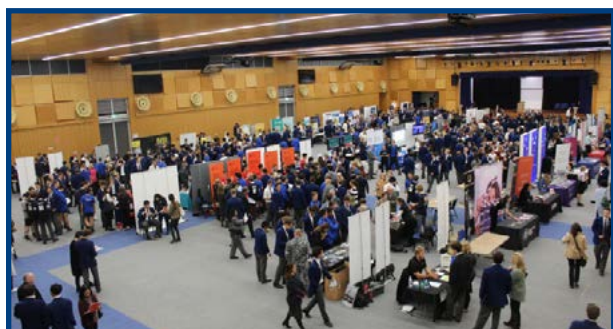
