The boys are to be congratulated for the way they have conducted themselves over the last month with assessments. The last few weeks in particular have been very busy and this will help get them ready for what to expect next term during the exam period. As we get to the business end of the Preliminary HSC course, it is important that the boys evaluate their preparation and performance and identify any adjustments that are required in preparation for the final term of Year 11.

The Half Yearly report, which will be issued next Friday 29 June, will assist with this evaluation. A well-designed study plan over the break will incorporate a good balance of school work, adequate sleep (an essential study skill), recreation and social activities. As a benchmark, and based on the

experiences of successful Year 11 students in the past, averaging a minimum of three hours of study and revision a day following a well-deserved program. should be a realistic expectation. We believe a good habit to develop during the holiday period is to commit to a routine whereby school work is done at the same time each day. Following the structure of the School Timetable is a great starting point and provides a 'ready made' study plan. FROM THE DEPUTY HEADMASTER

Please read below a reminder received from the Department of Transport, to all local schools, in regard to Opal cards and student behavior on public transport.

It is important that all students issued with free travel passes carry their Opal card with them and remember to tap on and off each time. It is a requirement for all travelling customers to have a valid ticket prior to boarding otherwise they may be subject to a fine of up to \$200. Encouraging the correct use of Opal cards provides safety and security for students. It also provides accurate statistical usage for future public transport planning and helps identify train stations needing extra resources.

Please remind students to use their Opal card and update their details if their Opal card is no longer valid. The process for updating student details (including applying for a new card) can now be done online. Click here for a copy of the School Opal card brochure for your reference. You can also access a list of FAQs.

We remind the students of the need to display the values of Knox in their interactions with the public. I have been so pleased to receive many positive accounts from members of the public regarding the behaviours and attitudes the students show when travelling to and from Knox.
