Half Yearly Reports: to ensure reports are available for the Student/Parent/Teacher Evening (Student Led Conference), reports will be published online at 3.30pm on Friday 22 March and will be available to view through Student Café and Parent Lounge. As was the case with the KAI interviews last year, a 15-minute booking can be made around the availability of your son's Academic Mentor. The online booking system for this interview will open in the first week of Term 2. More information will be sent later this term.

CAREERS ADVISOR

There is much anticipation from students about the university application process. UAC have advised schools that applications for university will open on 3 April and they will email all students a UAC PIN by the end of March. Students will then use their UAC PIN number and NESA Student Number to log into the UAC website when applications open on 3 April. Upon receiving information from UAC, I will guide and support the students in the university application process.



Australian National University (ANU) applications for 2020 university admission opened on 4 March and will close on 31 May 2019. ANU are now managing their own applications since they have introduced the additional co-curricular and/or service requirement which students must meet in order for their application to be successful. Students who miss the application deadline can still apply through UAC, but entry will be subject to ANU program availability. Please see [ANU's website](#) for details.

The UCAT is a compulsory test for students who are interested in undergraduate medicine. UCAT registrations are now open. As test dates are restricted to 1 - 31 July, it is strongly recommended that students register to sit the UCAT ASAP in order to secure a spot to sit the test. Registration is via the [UCAT Official website](#).


KNOX GALA DAY - SAVE THE DATE
